Infant and prenatal surgery: Pavia's excellence flies to Morocco - RABAT

Apr. 23 - Science, research, medicine and childhood are the themes of the event scheduled this afternoon in Rabat, in the conference room of the Department of Medicine and Pharmacy at University Mohammed V. Promoted by the Italian Cultural Institute in Rabat and the Moroccan university, the conference will see Dr. Gloria Pelizzo discuss "Research for life in infant and prenatal surgery." Pelizzo, a pediatric surgeon, is director of Pediatric Surgery at the Fondazione IRCCS Policlinico S. Matteo in Pavia. The conference will highlight the most modern and innovative aspects of pediatric surgery and the new methodologies associated with it. Pelizzo has a rich curriculum: after graduating in Medicine in Ferrara, she completed her medical training between Italy and France. She worked in Marseille and Lyon (where until 1998 was assistant surgeon at the Hospital Herriot Lyon), then at the Pediatric Institute "Burlo Garofalo" in Trieste, until she transferred to the Policlinico San Matteo in Pavia, a point of reference for pediatric surgery.
